From the Pastor's Desk

Two years ago, we prepared and submitted a pastoral plan for the Cathedral of St. Joseph. I'm writing today to give you an update on the status of that plan and on what we hope to accomplish during its third and final year of implementation. Next summer, we will discern a new plan, with new goals for our parish family.

The first goal of our current plan is to implement a formal system of volunteer coordination. In order to successfully reach this goal, we pointed to the need for a Time & Talent form that was easy to use and understand and a better database for use by parish staff to record parishioners' responses and track participation. During the past couple of months, our Stewardship Council has been working on an updated version of the Time & Talent form and brief descriptions for each of the ministries listed on that form. All of that material will be ready for distribution by August 11th. The Stewardship Council was fully aware of your concern that last year's form was too complicated with all the various classifications assigned to each ministry. We hope this year's form is much more user-friendly.

Since January, our staff members have also been working very hard to familiarize themselves with a new parish database software called Realm. We believe this software will make it easier for the Cathedral both to maintain volunteer lists and to communicate with those volunteers as needed, and we plan to launch it later this year. One thing that we have not yet achieved is the ability to distribute volunteering more evenly across the parish. Therefore, I am happy to have Mr. Steve Meystrik joining us on a regular basis, starting in January, to specifically oversee our volunteer coordination efforts. I am also grateful for the many parishioners who have been willing to become Virtus compliant since all of our volunteer ministries essentially require this compliance.

The second goal of our current plan is to implement a new youth group for high-school-aged members. Although we have not been able to complete this goal, we plan to begin it. Mrs. Julie Gramlich, Mrs. Barb Prasad and I are assisting Ms. Anna Porting, our new Director of Youth Ministry, planning and preparing ways to engage our junior-high and high-school-aged youth more frequently at the Cathedral. One of the consistent topics of discussion among priests, school faculty, and the laity is the absence of our youth at Sunday Masses. The Parish invests heavily in Catholic education to prepare future leaders for the Church, and we want to see a fruitful return on that investment. And so does our Lord! We will keep you informed of our ideas as they develop and are implemented.

Once again, please accept my sincere thanks for your prayers, support, and faithfulness as disciples of Christ.

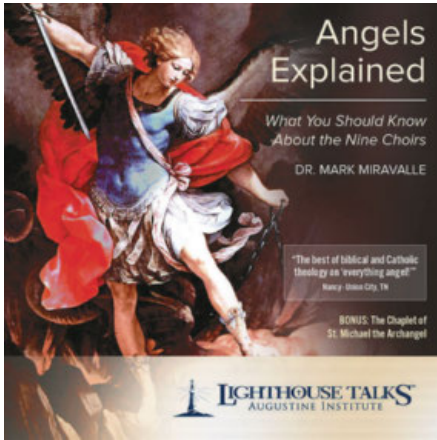

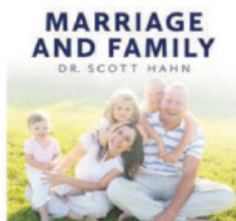

WORLD DAY FOR GRANDPARENTS AND THE ELDERLY

Pope Francis has decided to institute the Church-wide celebration of World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly. **Starting this year, it will be held on the fourth Sunday of July, July 24**, close to the liturgical memorial of Saints Joachim and Anne, the grandparents of Jesus. Cardinal Farrell, Prefect of the Dicastery for Laity, Family and Life, pointed out that “this is the first fruits of the *Amoris Laetitia* Family Year, a gift to the whole Church that is destined to continue into the future.
